St. Peter's Church.

SERVICES.

Sundays: 10-30 a.m. and 7 p.m. Children's Service and Baptisms on the 3rd Sunday in the month at 2-30 p.m. Holy Communion at noon on the 1st Sunday, at 8 a.m. on other Sundays in the month.

Saints' Days and Week-days: Morning Prayer at 10 a.m. when the Vicar is at home; the Church is, as a rule, open all day for private prayer.

Sunday School: In Parish Room every Sunday, 2-15 to 3-15, except on the third Sunday in the month.

Class for Choir Boys: In Parish Room every Sunday at 6 p.m.

Choir Practise in Church: Every Thursday evening at 7 p.m.

Parish Notes.

St. Peter's Day, June 29th, 1894, will ever be a memorable day in the history of our parish. On it our new Church, dedicated to the holy Apostle St. Peter, was consecrated by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese in the presence of a large number of our parishioners and friends. The touching memories connected with it are known to you all. Begun as a memorial to a beloved husband and brother, by the death of Mrs. T. J. Hibbert herself before its completion, it will ever now stand as a double memorial to husband and wife. Mr. Henry Hibbert has most nobly and generously carried out the wishes of her who has gone. Other friends also have contributed various gifts which all combine to make the whole as perfect and beautiful as possible. The weather on the 29th was all that could be desired. A very large number of clergy attended. The Service, which was fully choral, was heartily joined in by all present, a few members of the Cartmel Choir kindly helping our own to lead the music. The Bishop's sermon from the text: "That at the least the shadow of Peter having by night overshadowed some of them." Acts v. 15, was most appropriate to St. Peter's Day: he concluded with an appeal to all the parishioners to value the great privilege they possessed in having such a Church in their midst. The latter part of the Service was held in the Churchyard, round the new portion of which the Bishop, Clergy and Surpliced Choir walked in procession. Hymn 225, "Brief life is here our portion," brought a most solemn and impressive Service to a close.
